NCCE trained women co-operators for skill up-gradation

As per government of India policy as well as considering the need for empowerment of Indian women by employment generation and increasing daily income through cooperative systems. The National Centre for Cooperative Education (NCCE) of NCUI has conducted a Leadership Development Programme for Chairpersons/ Directors of women cooperatives for different States of India 12-14 June, 2017 at New Delhi for upgradation of managerial and entrepreneurship skills so that they can establish micro-enterprise in the cooperative societies and engage more women and youth of rural areas for their respective and regular income mainly based on agriculture. The participants have also been provided a platform to interact with other participants and discussed the challenges and issues and their solutions for proper functioning of cooperative activities. The responsibility and functions of the Board of Directors are very important to achieve the targets and providing satisfactory services to the members. Therefore, different subjects were incorporated and tailored this programme as a training capsule specially for women cooperatives.

Shri N. Satyanarayana, Chief Executive, NCUI was inaugurated the programme said, that Cooperatives are playing very important role to increase the income of women by undertaking different activities in the cooperative. They have also potential to establish micro / small enterprise through self help groups and cooperative system. In this programme the various relevant topics were discussed by experts / faculties of NCCE as per plan. The participants visited at National Small Industries Corporation Ltd (NSIC), Okhla for practical learning on different entrepreneur activities and discuss with experts as well as skill trainers in detail. The women studied the economics of different projects preparation and operations of machines and to be explore the possibility for diversification the activities in their cooperative societies. The doordarshan (DD KISAN) has given coverage and telecast programme on 15th June, 2017.

On the occasion of valediction, Dr. V.K. Dubey, Director, NCCE said that the knowledge gained by the participants may be utilised in their work place for better prospectus.
