

WOMEN CO-OPERATORS TRAINED BY NCCE FOR THEIR CAPACITY BUILDING

The National Centre for Cooperative Education (NCCE) of NCUI has organised 3 days Leadership Development Programme for Chairpersons/ Directors of Women Cooperatives of India from 8th to 10th January, 2018 at New Delhi for up-gradation of managerial and entrepreneurship skills so that they can manage their cooperative societies by professionally. The participants also trained about preparation and planning methods to establish micro-enterprise on cooperatives SHG basis to involve more and more women and youth of rural areas for their remunerative and regular income mainly based on agriculture. Accordingly various subjects were incorporated in the day to day programme and tailored as a training capsule specially for women cooperatives on entrepreneurship.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. A. R. Srinath, Dy. Director, NCCE. In his address he said, that Women Cooperatives are playing very positive role to increase the income of women by undertaking different activities especially in the cooperative. He also said that agro-based small processing unit should be commenced by women in rural area so that the house hold farmers income can be increase double upto 2022. Dr. Srinath also emphasised that the knowledge gained by the participants may be utilised in their work place for better prospective. The participants have delivered their positive remarks and share their experience. Smt. Veena Sachdeva, Asstt. Director, coordinated the programme successfully and all participants highly appreciated the programme and suggested more programmes should be organised for women cooperatives so that skill of women can be build-up as tool of income and employment generation in India.

During the interactive session Shri N. Satyanarayana, Chief Executive, NCUI in his special address informed the participants that women are need to play very important part in income generating activities for the development of society. He has also emphasized that there is a need of sensitization of women for betterment. Besides he compared the examples of AMUL and SAHARA Societies for their success and achievement.

Besides deliberately were also been made by Government Officials, Sr. Officials and professional organisations. As a part of the programme the participants has been visited to Topic Centre NCDC, Gurgaon. The participants learnt about the NCDC Schemes and Strategy for Cooperative Development, Common Loan Application & Requirements for NCDC Assistance, Integrated Approach for Cooperative Development and Attributes of Successful Cooperatives. All women were very much impressed by this visit.
