

WOMEN CO-OPERATORS TRAINED BY NCCE FOR THEIR CAPACITY BUILDING

As per government of India and NCUI policy to empower Indian women by increasing employment and daily income through cooperative systems. Consequently the National Centre for Cooperative Education (NCCE) of NCUI has taken up policy and planned to organise 3 days Leadership Development Programme for Chairpersons/ Directors of women cooperatives of India from 18th December to 20th December, 2017 at New Delhi for up gradation of managerial and entrepreneurship skills so that they can manage their cooperative societies professionally. The participants also trained about preparation and planning methods to establish micro-enterprise on cooperative or SHG basis to engage more women and youth of rural areas for their remunerative and regular income mainly based on agriculture. Accordingly different subjects were incorporated in the programme schedule and tailored as a training capsule specially for women cooperatives on entrepreneurship.

The programme was inaugurated by Dr. V. K. Dubey, Director, NCCE. He said, that Cooperatives are playing very positive role to increase the income of women by undertaking different activities in the cooperative. He also said that agro-based small processing unit should be commenced by women in rural area so that the house hold farmers income increase double upto 2022. Dr. Dubey also emphasised that the knowledge gained by the participants may be utilised in their work place for better prospective. The participants have delivered their positive remarks and share their experience. Dr. G. S. Azad, Consultant & Dr. A. R. Srinath, Dy. Director, NCUI were also present on the occasion. Smt.
