I shall be awaiting comments and suggestions of the readers for making this profile more meaningful in its future editions.

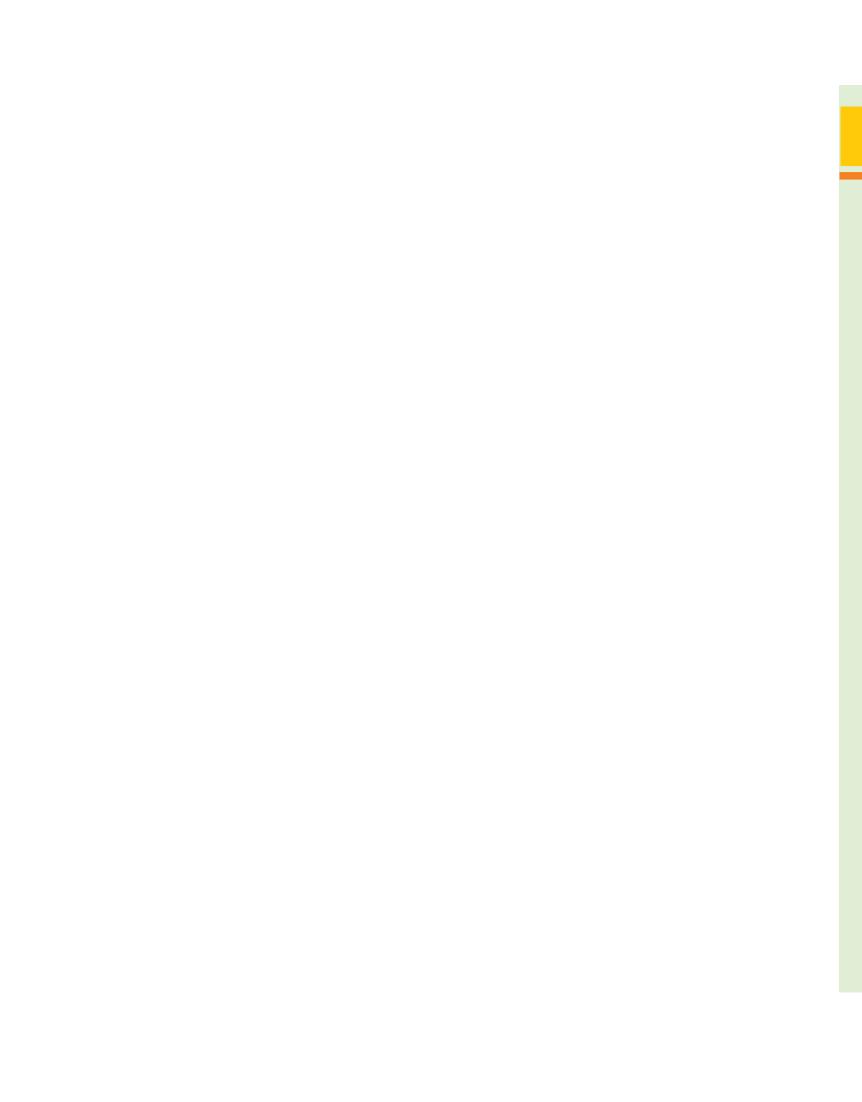

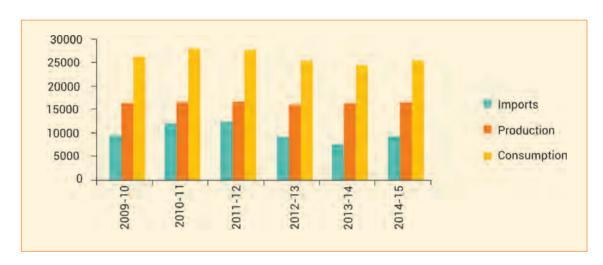

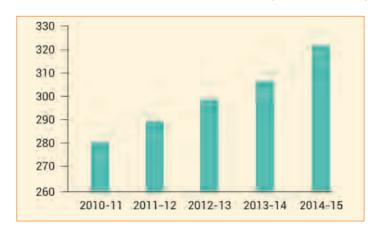

MILK PRODUCTION (N MILLION TONNES)

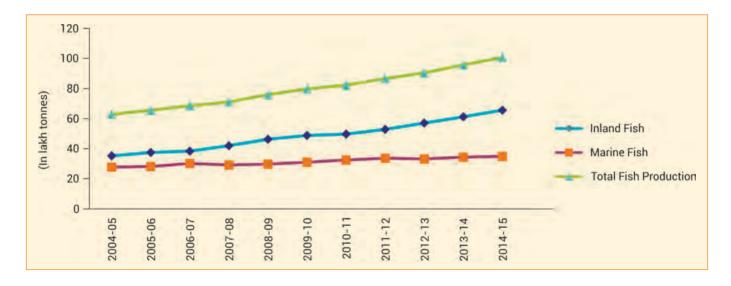


PER CAPITA AVAILABILITY OF MILK (GRAMS/DAY)



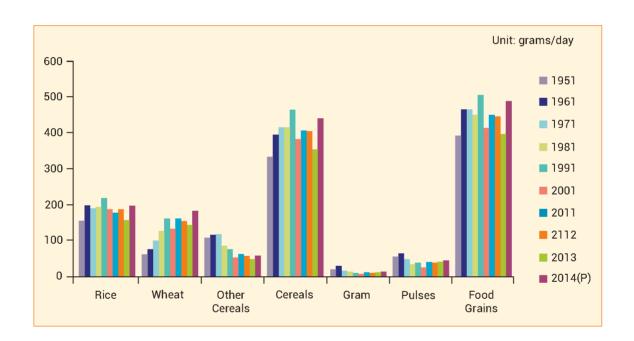

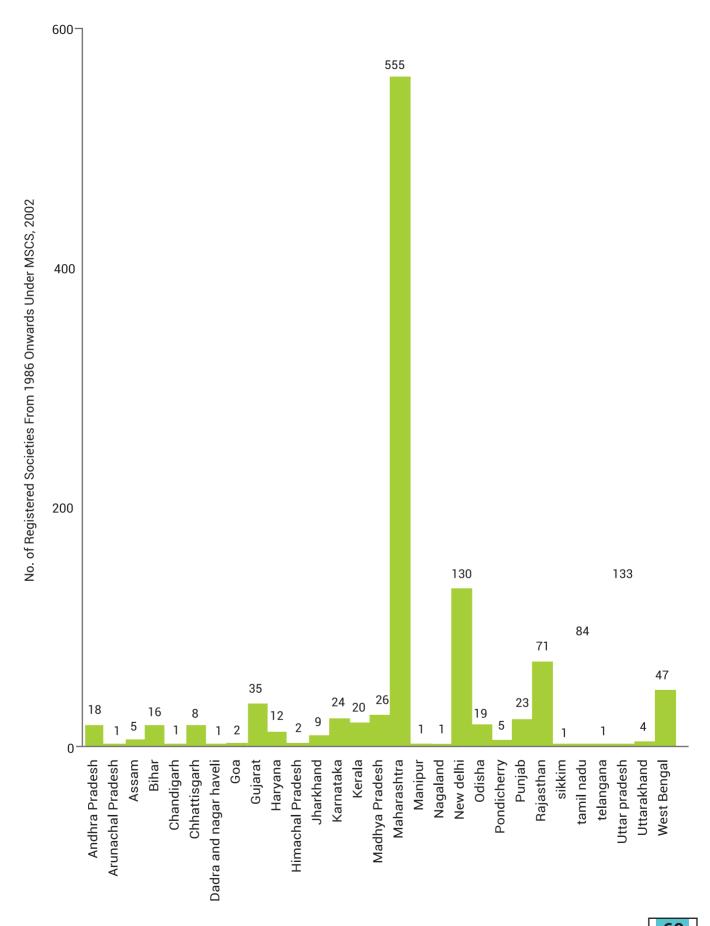

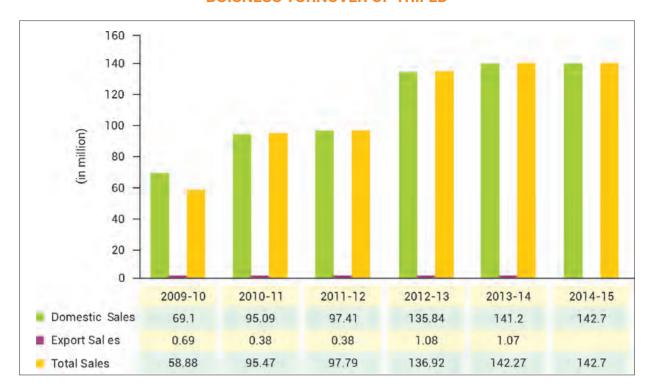
TOTAL TURNOVER OF NAFED

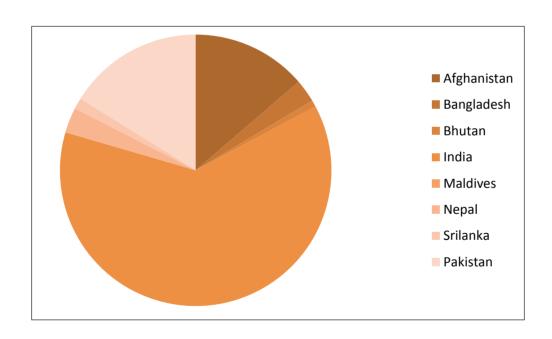
